Notes:

(1) Automatic Rifles: These are actually Light Machine Guns (LMGs). (2) Bomb Guns: These are Lebel VB Grenade Launchers (i.e. Light Mortars).

* Greece officially dropped the "Mountain" and "Normal" distinctions prior to the war and all Divisions were categorised simply as "Infantry Divisions". However Ex-Mountain Divisions were equipped with Howitzers in their Artillery Regiment, while most Ex-Normal Divisions had Field Guns instead of Howitzers (often all 3 Groups had 75mm Guns).

** In the actual table this has the notation ";" presumably denoting the quantities of items marked varied.

Some final comments:

1. During the course of the campaign Divisional Military Bands were disbanded to provide additional replacements for Infantry units.
2. The Artillery Regiment was named after the Division (e.g. the IV Division had the IV Artillery Regiment), and the "Groups" (Battalions) were usually designated a, b, and g (Alpha, Beta, Gamma) e.g. XIIIb is the Second Group of the XIII Artillery Regiment. There appears no pattern to which group (a, b, or g) had the 105mm Howitzers.
